Topic Background:

The Zika virus first emerged 50 years ago in monkeys found in Uganda's Zika forest. The first human cases of the mosquito-borne disease were reported in 1952. Since then outbreaks have occurred in the Americas, Africa, Asia, and the Pacific Islands. In February 2016, the World Health Organization designated the Zika virus a public health emergency of international concern, estimating up to 4 million people could be infected by year's end.

"The Incompetence of Washington" by Gov. Rick Scott, September 22, 2016
