Topic Background:

The French and Indian War was the North American conflict in a larger imperial war between Great Britain and France known as the Seven Years' War. The French and Indian War began in 1754 and ended with the Treaty of Paris in 1763. The war provided Great Britain enormous territorial gains in North America, but disputes over subsequent frontier policy and paying the war's expenses led to colonial discontent, and ultimately to the American Revolution.

Source(s) Used:

The source used for this assessment is Benjamin Franklin's political cartoon "Join or Die," created in May, 1754. The image is a divided snake, with sections labeled as "S.C., N.C., V., M., R., N.J., N.Y., and N.E." Franklin was warning the British colonies that unless they united together, they would be defeated by the French and their Native American allies.
