Topic Background:

The Federal Art Project (FAP) was created in 1935 to provide work relief for artists in various mediapainters, sculptors, muralists and graphic artists, with various levels of experience. Holger Cahill, a curator and fine and folk art expert, was appointed director of the program. As with the other Federal cultural projects of the time, the program sought to bring art and artists into the everyday life of communities throughout the United States, through community art centers, exhibitions and classes.

 - a. The bright yellow color of the buildings in the background shows that tenement houses are bright and cheery places to live.
 - b. The hanging clothes show that people living in tenements had to hang their clothes outside in order to dry.
 - c. The items at the bottom of the poster show that people living in tenements often left their goods and trash on the ground surrounding tenements.
 - d. The red and gray colors of the tenement buildings show that these dwellings were dark, dangerous places for families to live.
